## Safety guidelines for World Youth Draughts Championship (100) in Szklarska Poręba during COVID-19 pandemic

## § 1 General guidelines

- 1. These guidelines describe the rules during the World Youth Draughts Championship (100) with regard to safety measures.
- 2. The aim of these guidelines is to provide safety for the Championship participants.
- 3. Each participant is obliged to get acquainted with these guidelines. Not being familiar with them does not exempt the participant from following the guidelines.
- 4. Players participate in the Championship voluntarily and at their own risk.
- 5. The participants of the Championship are obliged to follow the principles of social coexistence and to behave according to the legal order and these guidelines, as well as to obey the law and regulations in force in Poland and established by the organizer.
- 6. Despite the guidelines prepared by the organizer to minimize the risk of SARS-CoV-2 infection, the risk of infection still exists.
- 8. The Polish Draughts Federation cannot be held responsible for any possible SARS-CoV-2 infection of the Championship participants during the pandemic.

## § 2 Organizer's Guidelines

- 1. All participants of the Championship, namely, players, coaches, accompanying people, referees and organizers are obliged to wear safety masks covering the nose and mouth. The organizer provides masks for the players. The masks will be placed on the tables of the round referees.
- 2. All participants of the Championship, namely, players, coaches, accompanying people, referees and organizers are obliged to wear badges in the playing hall and canteen. In case of not having a badge in the playing hall or canteen, the person may be asked to leave the room or canteen.

- 3. Entering the playing hall and canteen, all participants are required to disinfect their hands. The organizer provides disinfectants in designated areas: at the door of the playing hall, at the entrance to both the canteen and the hotel.
- 4. It is advisable to avoid direct contact when greeting or saying goodbye, as well as at the end of the round, and during the closing ceremony.
- 5. In order to reduce the number of people in the playing hall, parents and coaches are allowed to stay for only the first 15 minutes of the round. After this time, only players, referees, organizers and one representative of each country.
- 5. The organizer provides boards to play which can be disinfected. The disinfection of boards will take place after each round.
- 6. The organizer shall provide one clearly and visibly marked container for used face masks, which will be placed near the entrance to the playing hall.
- 7. The organizer does not provide a 'coffee area', but bottled drinks may be taken to the playing hall.
